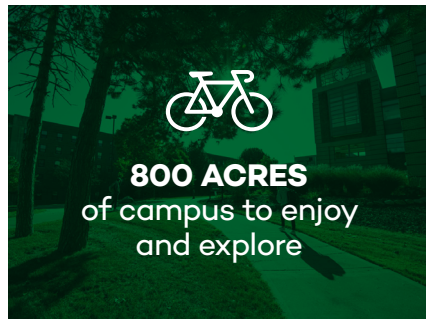

Preparing for your Visa Interview

- **For an F1 visa please check the embassy website for required documents and processes.**
- You are required to pay the I-901 SEVIS fee before making a visa appointment. You need to have your:
 - SEVIS ID (found on the Form I-20)
 - EMU school code (DET214F00310000)
 - Passport number
- The fee can be paid online at <https://www.fmjfee.com/i901fee/index.html>
- **If given the option, we recommend completing the visa interview in English**

To prepare for the visa interview, the following questions might be asked:

- **Where will you study?**
 - State (Michigan), name of school (Eastern Michigan University)
- **What are you studying?**
 - Your major
- **Why did you choose that major?**
 - Learn about the program of study
- **Who is sponsoring your program?**
 - Your source of funds
- **What is your plan after completing the program?**
 - Tie to home country

Undergraduate Cost & Financial Aid

→ EMU does not charge international students out-of-state, non-resident tuition.

→ All first-year applicants are considered for the 4WARD Graduation Scholarship. This scholarship pays the third and fourth year of tuition, a savings of nearly \$14,000.

Tuition (24 credit hours per year)

\$14,810

Insurance (Required for F-1 international students)

\$2,244

Room and Board (Housing and meal plan)

Graduate Cost & Financial Aid

- All international applicants are automatically considered for the National Scholars Program (NSP). This scholarship pays the difference between resident and non-resident tuition. To qualify, students must have a cumulative GPA of 3.6 or above on a 4.0 scale.
- Students with a cumulative GPA between 3.2 and 3.59 will qualify for the Student Success Program, a scholarship of \$3,100 per academic year for up to two years.

Undergraduate Admissions Requirements



1. Apply at emich.edu/apply. Use the fee waiver code **INTL** to waive the application fee. The application deadline is November 1 for Winter semester and July 1 for Fall semester.
2. Submit **official high school transcripts**. Transcripts can be sent electronically or by mail and must come directly from your school. Transcripts that are not issued in English must be accompanied by a professional translation.
3. Send official **English proficiency test** scores. EMU accepts the following exams: TOEFL, IELTS, PTE, and Michigan English Test (MET). The minimum score requirements are:

TOEFL: 61 iBT / **IELTS:** 6.0 / **PTE:** 44 / **MET:** 48

Students from some countries may be eligible for an English proficiency waiver. More information can be found at: tiny.emich.edu/intlug

SAT and ACT test scores are not required for international applicants.

Graduate Admissions Requirements



1. Apply at emich.edu/apply. Use the fee waiver code **GRAD** to waive the application fee. The application deadline is November 1 for Winter semester and July 1 for Fall semester. Please note that some programs may have earlier application deadlines than the university.
2. Submit an **official transcript evaluation**. All post-secondary transcripts from non-U.S. institutions must be submitted directly to an approved evaluator for a detailed, course-by-course report. EMU works with the following evaluation services: Educational Credential Evaluators (ECE), Educational Perspectives (EP), SpanTran, and World Education Services (WES)
3. Send official **English proficiency test** scores. EMU accepts the following exams: TOEFL, IELTS, and PTE. The minimum score requirements are:
TOEFL: 79 iBT / **IELTS:** 6.5 / **PTE:** 53

4. Most graduate programs have additional admission requirements, such as recommendations, personal statements, or GRE/ GMAT exam scores. Go to catalog.emich.edu to check the admission requirements for your program.
